Todos los Santos

Muchas veces al impartir nuestras catequesis sobre la santidad a niños y adultos, he notado que la palabra "santo" nos parece muy lejana e imposible de hacerla nuestra. Tal parece que el llamado a la santidad fuera para muy pocas personas. Sin embargo, la fiesta que celebramos hoy en la Iglesia nos habla precisamente del llamado que tenemos todas las personas a la santidad. Esta fiesta exalta y sostiene nuestra esperanza de que algún día nuestras vidas terminaran unidas definitivamente a Cristo Jesús. La lectura del libro del Apocalipsis nos dice que los marcados eran ciento cuarenta y cuatro mil. Ahora cabe que nos preguntemos lo siguiente: ¿alguna vez en nuestra vida hemos reflexionado que pertenecemos a la comunión de los santos? ¿Qué significado tiene esto en el comportamiento de nuestra vida? Deseo que esta festividad de Todos los Santos y Santas de Dios nos anime a ser fieles en nuestra vocación cristiana y trabajar unidos por una sociedad más justa.

Did You Know?...Ask Fr. Ron

St. Michael's Byzantine Rite Russian Catholic Chapel in New York

Following the Bolshevik Revolution in Russia in November 1917, the new Communist government began to persecute all religious institutions. Those Byzantine Rite Russian Catholics who were able to escape emigrated to the West and established Byzantine Rite Russian parish communities in the cities where they settled. In 1936, St. Michael's Byzantine Rite Russian Catholic Chapel was established on Mulberry Street in Manhattan (between Prince and Houston Streets, adjacent to Old St. Patrick's Cathedral) to serve the liturgical and pastoral needs of those emigré Russian Byzantine Rite Catholics who had made their way to New York after the Russian Revolution and Civil War. Since the 1930s, St. Michael's has attracted not only subsequent waves of Russian refugees and immigrants, seeking to maintain their spiritual roots while finding their way in American society, but also many non-Russians attracted to the richness and beauty of the Byzantine liturgy and Russian spirituality. Among others, Dorothy Day frequently attended Vespers or the Divine Liturgy (Eucharist) with several of her fellow Catholic Workers. Catherine de Hueck Dougherty, who went on to found Madonna House in Canada and who wrote several practical works on prayer and spirituality reflecting Russian tradition, also attended during her later days in New York. On occasion during his younger years, Thomas Merton also came to St. Michael's to share in the Divine Liturgy. The office of Great Vespers is celebrated on Saturdays at 6:00 p.m., and the Divine Liturgy (Eucharist) on Sundays at 11:00 a.m.

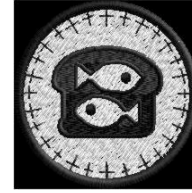
