Dear Friends in the Risen Christ –

Openings, the Paulist Fathers' visual arts ministry in which artists explore the connection between their creativity and spirituality is presenting an important exhibit in the Church next week. The exhibit is entitled, **Freedom and Beauty: The Art of Iraqi Refugees**, and features paintings and drawings by Iraqi refugees Wassan Al Kabi, Rawaa Tareg Al-Na'aiemy, Aktham A. Al-Sayegh, Amal Alwan Maseer, and Thar A. Al-Sayegh. The exhibit opens this Thursday, April 30th in the Church and runs through May 28th.

This exhibition brings to light 15 art pieces that explore loss, tragedy and the violent turmoil that continues to plague the Middle East, while giving way to the message of hope and peace.

The artists are refugees from Iraq who fled the country during the regime of Saddam Hussein, had returned to Iraq only to flee again after death threats from the Ba'athist party militia. Wassan with her mother, sister and two brothers; Thar, and his wife Rawaa with their three children; and Aktham with his mother, sister, brother, sister-in-law and their children are part of the Iraqi refugee population in Amman, Jordan. Amal and her three children have been fortunate enough to find a temporary safe haven in New Paltz, NY.

Cathy Breen, a member of the advocacy group Catholic Worker movement in New York that aids the poor and marginalized, has been working with Iraqi refugees in Iraq, Syria and Jordan for several years, and has also been dedicated to surveying outlets in which their artwork can be exhibited and sold, with the proceeds going directly to the artists. All works in this exhibit are available for purchase. Reproductions of select works will also be for sale.

Now during this Easter Season, Father Ron has suggested *The Breaking of the Bread: The Development of the Eucharist according to Acts*, by Eugene LaVerdiere, *The Last Word: Beyond the Bible Wars to a New Understanding of the Authority of Scripture*, by N.T. Wright, and *An Introduction to the Devout Life*, by St. Francis de Sales. Three wonderful books to encourage some thoughts about your faith.

Did You Know?...Fr. Ron Franco

In popular piety the month of May has been traditionally associated with the Blessed Virgin Mary (perhaps in part to counteract an ancient pagan custom of crowning a "May Queen" in connection with an ancient festival of the goddess of spring). In the Church's liturgical calendar, May largely corresponds to the Easter season and the solemnities of Ascension and Pentecost. Hence the Church desires May devotions to emphasize Mary's participation in the Easter Mystery and in beginning of the Church at Pentecost. According to the Acts of the Apostles, after her Son's Ascension, Mary waited with the other disciples for the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost - "and so became the perfect pattern of the Church at prayer" (*Preface, Mass of Mary, Image and Mother of the Church*). The Holy Spirit had earlier come uniquely upon Mary at the Annunciation, when she became the mother of Christ and his first disciple. Then, on the cross, Christ gave Mary as mother to his beloved disciple, thereby signifying her maternal relationship with his Church.

The daily order of the Church's liturgical prayer (*The Liturgy of the Hours*) concludes after Night Prayer with an antiphon addressed to the Blessed Virgin Mary. During the Easter season, this is always the 12th century antiphon *Regina Coeli*, which, since 1743, has also replaced the familiar *Angelus* during this season in daily devotions (and also therefore at recent Popes' weekly window appearance in St. Peter's Square at noon each Sunday). *Queen of heaven, rejoice, alleluia. The Son you merited to bear, alleluia, has risen as he said, alleluia. Pray for us to God, alleluia. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.*
